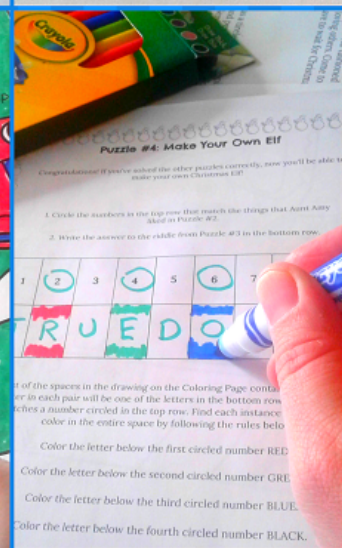
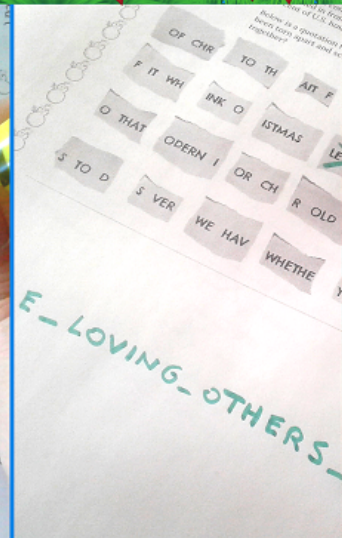
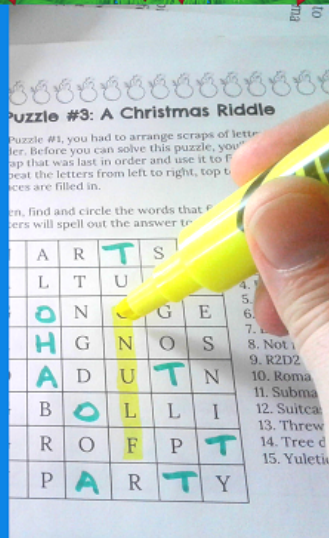

Bob Hope (born Leslie Townes Hope, 1903 - 2003) was a stand-up comedian, singer, dancer and actor who starred in over 50 films. He was best known for his televised comedy specials. In 1970 and 1971, his Christmas specials, performed in front of American troops in Vietnam, were seen by more than 60 percent of U.S. households!

Did you know? Bob Hope was a tireless philanthropist. For 50 years, he organized and performed in tours for the nonprofit USO (United Service Organizations), entertaining military troops from World War II all the way through to the Persian Gulf War. In 1969, President Lyndon B. Johnson awarded him the Presidential Medal of Freedom for his service to the armed forces.
